## **Hearing** **Screening**

On May 2nd, Grant Wood Area Education Agency (GWAEA) will be screening all students in Kindergarten, 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grades. Students with IEPs will also be screened. Students in 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, junior high, and high school who are new to the school that don't have a documented hearing screening on file will be screened as well. Some students with a history of known hearing loss will also be tested. Follow-up testing may occur periodically if previous hearing test results were not within normal limits. Parents/guardians not wishing to have their student tested should notify Denise Jorgensen in the office in writing before **April 22**.

## **Summer Review Workbooks**

The school year is quickly coming to a close, and the summer months are rapidly approaching. Summer is a great chance for students to enjoy a break from schoolwork. However, statistics show that students can lose up to two months of scholastic skills over the summer if they do not spend any time reviewing what they have learned. They are designed for each of the various grade levels (Kindergarten – 6<sup>th</sup> grades).
