About 9 years ago, Mr. Starks approached Mrs. Curry, our 4th grade teacher, and asked if she could use a volunteer in the classroom to listen to students recite Bible verses. Mr. Starks has been volunteering in the fourth grade class ever since. He takes the time to make connections with each student, and when they recite their verses, Mr. Starks follows up with questions about the verse, giving them time to individually talk to him about what the verse is saying to them.

In January, Mr. Starks had surgery on his shoulder and told the students he wasn't sure when or if he'd be able to drive to come back this school year. The students prayed for him every day for weeks, and a few weeks ago, he started coming on Fridays again. Thank you, Ken, for volunteering and pouring into the lives of our students.

Score!

Our students were busy talking about goals and scores last month at Isaac Newton Christian Academy. Super Bowl? World Cup? Rider's Cup? World Series? Olympic scores? Not this time! The students were excited to set goals for themselves for the Iowa Assessments, which were administered in late March.

lowa Assessments are a series of tests in core areas of Language Arts, Math, Social Studies, and Science. Isaac Newton Christian Academy administers the lowa Assessments in the spring to students in grades three through eleven. The tests include: vocabulary, word analysis, listening, language, mathematics, computation, reading, social studies and science. Results are provided for the complete battery as well as the core battery of vocabulary, word analysis, reading, listening, language, math and computation. These tests are useful in tracking growth and proficiency from year to year for the individual students and the grade level from year to year. They can provide evidence of effective instruction and can highlight teaching practices that should be replicated. The results can also pinpoint gaps that need to be addressed.



Our students set goals for their lowa Assessment tests

To prepare for the excitement of the tests, students who had taken the tests in 2022 at Isaac Newton were presented with a copy of the results to refresh their knowledge of the individual results. National Percentile Ranks and National Standard Scores were shown, explained, and discussed. Many students were surprised at the results. Some were very pleased and other students felt they could have performed better than what was shown. Therefore, each student set a personal goal in one area. For example, one student set a goal to increase her National Standard Score in Reading by 15 points. Students who attained their goals were presented with an Isaac Newton Christian Academy keychain and have their names displayed in the entryway.

Students First Act & ESAs

On January 24, 2023, Governor Kim Reynolds signed the Students First Act into law. This law creates Educational Savings Accounts (ESAs) for eligible K-12 students attending an accredited non-public school. Isaac Newton Christian Academy is accredited and these funds are for our students!

In the first four days after the bill passed, our school was contacted by families representing 107 students. We are hearing from these families that the passing of this bill is making it possible for them to choose a Christian education for the first time. Families are telling us that a Christian education is what they always wanted to provide for their children, but couldn't otherwise afford it. This is exciting! The result is that we are offering additional sections of grades to receive as many students as we can, in a controlled way. We are planning to shift our spaces around to make the best use of the space God has given us to educate the students God is sending us.

In October, long before we had any idea that the Students First Act would pass, we hired a site engineering and architect firm to look at our property and help us understand what we can fully do with the space for future growth. We didn't know then how providential this step was. The result is an exciting campus plan that allows for considerable growth. We intend to take things slowly as we discover this new landscape we find ourselves in. We want to be wise and strategic in our growth. However, it is time to begin planning again for more space to bring our mission to more students.

Would you please pray for our school and its leadership? In the face of unprecedented growth, we must be very careful stewards of the opportunity that God has given us. We desire to lead the school in the midst of this growth in a way that does not compromise our mission, our admissions standards, or the important work that we do each day.
